DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS



The Telangana Prisons and Correctional Services Department, in collaboration with NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad, is working on the "Telangana" Prisons and Correctional Services Act, 2024" to replace the outdated Prisons Act of 1894. Additionally, the department has formed committee to draft a new Telangana Prison Manual as per guide lines of the Model Prisons Manual of the Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi, which will be submitted to the Telangana Government for approval upon completion.

PRISONERS WELFARE

The Telangana Prisons Department has started a welfare program to help prisoners reconnect with their families and return to society. As part of this program, eligible prisoners are given parole or furlough to spend time with their loved ones. This helps strengthen family bonds and reduces the chances of prisoners committing crimes again. By focusing on family support and social reintegration, the department aims to create a safer and more supportive community.

PAROLE & FURLOUGH

Parole is a conditional suspension of sentence granted for an initial period of 30 days to enable a prisoner to attend to domestic necessities. This facility is granted to all Convict Prisoners after undergoing a certain period of sentence. The Government is the authority to sanction Parole.

Furlough is another form of temporary release for 14 days which is granted as an incentive for good conduct once in 2 years. The period spent by the Prisoner is treated as sentence. The Director General of Prisons and Correctional Services is the authority to sanction Furlough.

INTEREST FREE LOANS TO INMATES

The Department has taken an initiative to provide loans to the convict prisoners who completed three years of conviction, for the purpose of education of children, daughters' marriages, businesses capital, etc. The Loans are issued interest free on installment basis and are recovered from the wages earned by the prisoners. So far, about 552 prisoners were sanctioned a loan amount of Rs. 1,73,08,500/-

PREMATURE RELEASE

The Telangana Government issued a grant of Special Remission vide G.O. Ms. No. 37, Home (Services-V) Dept., Dated: 02.07.2024. The Government has taken a policy decision and issued G.O. for grant of Special Remission to 205 Life & 08 Non-Life Convicted Prisoners. Based on their behaviour, jail term period and gravity of the cases the Government identified and released 213 prisoners, among which, 35 were women convict prisoners.

As a part of the Rehabilitation Program, the Prisons Department has provided jobs in the 'My Nation' Fuel Outlets to 70 convicts including 03 women convicts who were Prematurely Released, while 08 women convicts were provided with sewing machines so that they could take up tailoring and earn a livelihood.

TRAINING PROGRAM

The Telangana Prisons Department, in collaboration with the Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D), conducts sensitization programs on new criminal laws for prison personnel. These sessions are held at the State Institute of Correctional Administration and involve participation of officers and staff from Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Meghalaya, J&K.

The training program aims to provide prison personnel with critical insights into the new criminal laws and equip them with the necessary skills to efficiently manage the State's Prisons and Correctional institutions. The training planned in light of the significant changes in India's Criminal Justice System following the introduction of three new laws:

- 1. Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023 (replacing the Indian Penal Code, 1860),
- 2. Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023 (replacing the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973), and
- 3. Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam 2023 (replacing the Indian Evidence Act, 1872).

RECRUITMENT

During the year 2024, Deputy Jailors-5 & Stipendiary Warders -84 male & 8 Female have completed training and posted in various jails. Appointments of Junior Assistants Group -IV were given to 18 members. Vacancies of Deputy Superintendent of jails-5, Junior Assistants Group III- are notified through the Telangana Public Service Commission.

Along with Telangana Jail Warders, Andaman & Nicobar Island Jail Warders and Tihar jail warders from Delhi were also given training in State Institute of Correctional Administration, Telangana.

CREATION OF NEW POSTS IN PRISONS DEPARTMENT

A total of 12 New posts have been created, of which 6 at Central Prisons Sangareddy and 6 at Central Prison Nizamabad were sanctioned and issued vide G.O. Ms. No. 42, Finance (HRM-I).

PETROL BUNK OPENINGS

Telangana Prisons Department, is having one-of-its-kind partnership with the Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. and other oil companies (BPCL & HPCL) and established 29 Fuel Outlets fully operated by the semi-open prisoners and released inmates. STUDY VISIT TO THE PRISON INSTITUTIONS IN AUSTRALIA

The prison systems in India are facing unprecedented challenges due to a significant rise in the confinement of high-risk offenders such as terrorists, gangsters, drug peddlers, and cybercriminals. This situation necessitates upgrades in areas like maximum-security protocols, de-radicalization, and treatment programs for drug offenders. Recognizing the need for improvement, the Central Government and judiciary have emphasized better prison conditions and enhanced training for prison officers.

To address these needs, the Board of Management (BOM) of the Academy of Prisons & Correctional Administration (APCA), Vellore, TN, proposed engaging with advanced correctional systems abroad, particularly in countries like Australia, renowned for their exemplary practices. Therefore study visit to Australian prisons was identified as an opportunity to gain insights into international best practices and implement qualitative improvements in Indian prisons.
